



Learn Spanish classical guitar at the **Instituto Cervantes** Discover an essential part of Spanish culture

The classical guitar is one of Spain's most valuable traditions. Early in the 20th century, the Spanish artist Andres Segovia established the guitar as an instrument worthy of the concert stage. He also inspired many renowned contemporary composers to write music for the guitar, creating the foundation of a beautiful repertoire of music we enjoy today.

This 10-week Spanish classical guitar course will meet once a week for two hours. Open to all levels, the course will allow beginners to experience the joy of learning to play a musical instrument and will help those who already play the guitar to grow in their technique.

The course will focus on various aspects of the Spanish classical guitar and music, like classical guitar technique, sight reading and basic music theory. Students will also enjoy listening to a wide variety of classical guitar music.

Instructor **Daniel Garcia** holds a Master's Degree in Classical Guitar Performance from the University of Cincinnati. He studied Flamenco and Classical guitar for ten years in Madrid. Garcia has performed in a number of solo recitals in the United States, Spain and Canada and has made appearances in music festivals across the United States. He has also performed in symphony orchestra concerts in the United States and Spain. He currently gives private classes in New York City.
